## HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

The vision was born of magnificent wealth, the munificence of a noble dreamer, and of no mean Mammon, of course. In some lonely hours the great Sripat Singh Dugar, the last perhaps of the clan of the Jain Sitambar blue blood at Jiaganj, Murshidabad, felt he must do that. His worthy partner of life, the co-sharer of his dream, his wife Rani Dhanya Kumari Dugar inspired his vision. So, in 1949, in the month of April, the deed of gift was signed. Sripat Singh Dugar gifted his palatial outhouse (the magnificent 'Cutchery Bari'), with a further donation of seventy-five thousand rupees, for a college in this town of Jiaganj. It was Sripat Singh College, the first ever in this Sub-Division and in this vast region of rural West Bengal. On May 1, 1949, the Governing Body was formed with Sripat Singh Dugar as Founder President. On 11 June, the College was affiliated with the University of Calcutta. And on the auspicious morning of August 1, 1949, it took its first step as

a co-educational Intermediate college with the Principal Sri Jogesh Chandra Bhattacharya, three full-time Lecturers, one clerk, one Librarian, one helper, 42 students in the I.A. class and 29 in the I.Sc. To encourage sincere students Sripat Singhji donated Rs. 10,000.00 for funding scholarships. The college was raised to Degree standard when in 1951, in terms of Govt. rules; he made a further donation of Rs. 30,000.00 for working fund. So, in 1951, B.A. Pass course started here with 9 students.

For the permanent economic security and upkeep of the college the College, headed by Sripat Singh Dugar, moved the Government of West Bengal and particularly the then Chief Minister Dr. Bidhan Chandra Ray in 1953. In terms of Government Rules of the time Sripat Singhji donated One lakh rupees (Rs. 100000.00) along with the gift of the regular annuity of Rs 6000.00 every year from his Malda Properties. And so, in July, 1954, W.B. Government initiated the Govt. Sponsored Scheme with Sripat Singh College as the first Govt. Sponsored Co-educational Degree College in the state. In 1960, B.Sc. (Pass) course was introduced here. Progress was in pace. Learners thronged. Accommodation became a problem.

Sripat Singhji donated land adjacent to the building and with his co-operation much more land was purchased in 1958. In 1959, a large sum of financial assistance for building construction was available from U.G.C. and the W.B. Government. This joint fund of Rs. 1,94,000.00 was utilized for the construction of a spacious 3-storeyed building with more than thirty rooms and halls. In 1961, the building was ceremonially opened by Dr. K. L. Srimali, the Union Minister for Education. W.B. Chief Minister Sri Prafulla Chandra Sen was present in the function. Academic activities were transferred here in August, 1961, and the ancestral out-house of Sripat Singhji, i.e. the old building of the college has since then been named as the 'Administrative Building'.

## INFRASTRUCTURE

### ***Library Facilities:***

The college library shares its long and glorious history with the College itself. The College authority took interest in the development of the library from the outset. The foundation of the library was laid by the Principal Aswini Kumar Choudhury and the assistant Librarian Sri Bhabani Prasad Sen. Sri Rana Mitra Sen was the first full-time Librarian of the College (04.05.1960). In



1961 the library was shifted to the old building; Sri Sabita Prasad Dubey was the Librarian for a long time in the development period of the college. The open access system and cataloging system was started from 1974-1975. Our library started with only 148 textbooks at the beginning. The number of books was only one thousand before the college got the status of Government Sponsored. The growth of the library Collection can be said to have begun from the year 1971, when the number of the number of books was 9,866. In the year 1981, the number of books was 15,384, in 1991 the number was 22,578 and now at present there are more than 32500+ books in the library. The library has 24 wall maps and subscribes to 15 printed Journals, 1 e-Journal and 1 blended Journal (Online+Printed). The library has grown up mainly with the help of recurring grant of the College and sometimes grant from UGC. At present the development of the library is solely dependent on the grant from UGC. The Library also got donation from teachers, students, ex-students and others for its development. Sri Sohanlal Dugar of Calcutta donated Rs 2000 in 1963 for purchasing books. The library is located in the administrative building of the college with total space of 2500 sq. ft., Out of 2500 sq. ft. 1500 sq. ft. are used for stack purposes and 1000 sq. ft. for reading and lending purposes. College Library now uses KOHA as an integrated library Management system for acquisitions, cataloguing, Circulation of books and online public access. The Library Technical department uses MARC format for cataloguing of books and Z39.50 technology to search for and retrieve catalogue records.

***Computer Conveniences:*** The college boasts of a “fully-loaded”, internet-enabled computer lab, overseen by the Department of Computer Science. The lab is equipped with state-of-the-art computers, adequately matched and supported by Printers, Scanners, Routers, and other peripherals. In addition, all departments of the Science Faculty, in particular, are equipped with adequate computational facilities. The college has 15 separate routers for Broadband Internet access. Modifications are underway for introducing Internet access to all the departments through dedicated networks. The entire administrative setup is computerized.

***Laboratories:*** All the lab. based subjects are provided with well-equipped updated laboratories. Our departmental laboratories are the most preferred for conducting the University Practical Examinations in Hons. subjects. We owned try our best to keep space with the syllabi changes.

***Day Care Center:*** The college is proud to announce that it is the recipient of UGC Grant for the construction of a Day Care Center. This new addition was inaugurated by Shri Anisur Rahaman, Hon’ble Minister, Govt. of West Bengal, on the occasion of the Diamond Jubilee Celebration of the College on August 01, 2009. The center houses a Students’ Canteen and Refreshment Rooms for visiting faculty and is comming up to full working capacity in the very near future.

***Hostel – Boys’ and Girls’:*** The College boasts of hostel accommodation for both boys and girls.

The boys' hostel is older, with a boarding capacity of 100 students. The Foundation stone for the Girls' Hostel was laid by Hon'ble MP, Shri Moinul Hassan on November 05, 2007 and the Hostel was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Finance Minister, GOI, Shri Pranab Mukherjee on August 01, 2009 with a capacity for 100 boarders.

**Play Ground:** There is a well-equipped and protected playground with a hostel campus. Inter Classes and Inter college football and cricket tournaments are held there including the college's Annual Sports.

**Canteen:** A neat and clean canteen is a new addition situated on the ground floor of the proposed Auditorium building. The canteen is run by a bonafide agency approved by the Governing Body of the College. College Authority looks after the hygienic condition of the canteen.

**Garrage:** It is also a new addition besides the canteen run by an agency being approved by the authority. The regular bonafide students of the college enjoy the subsidized rate for keeping their bicycles and motorcycles with safety and security.

**Students' Health Home:** Students enjoy subsidized medical facilities and health care at the Students' Health Home. The College has been a valued member of the Organization from its very inception.

**Students' Union:** The College Constitution provides for the annual election of the Class Representative, Vice-President, General Secretary, and Games Secretary to the Students' Union. The Union organizes various cultural and social events: notable are the Annual Sports and Games, the Freshers' Welcome, and the College Annual Social Function. The Students' Union conducts its function from the student's union office situated at the ground floor of the Administrative Building.

**Common Room – Boys' and Girls':** There are separate boys' and girls' common rooms with facilities for indoor games. The boys' common room is at the Administrative Building and the Girls at the Academic Building.

**Audio-Visual Equipment As Part of Teaching and Learning:** Under the U.G.C. scheme and with its financial assistance the college has full sets of audio-visual systems including TV and VCP sets, projector, microphones, and other accessories.

colleagues took the total educational responsibility in Covid-Pandemic. Online Facilities provide our Students During Pandemic: With the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, the college took prompt measures to provide students with facilities to continue learning from their home.

### **The National Cadets Corps (NCC)**

The National Cadets Corps (NCC) has their headquarters at New Delhi. The cadets are given basic military training in small arms and parades. The officers and cadets have no liability for active military service once they complete their course but are given preference over normal candidates during selections based on their achievements in the corps. It is a voluntary organization that recruits cadets from schools, colleges, and universities all over India. The NCC is the biggest youth organization in India, it was formed under the National Cadet Corps Act of 1948. It was raised on 15th July, 1948. It can be traced back to the “University Corps“, created under the Indian Defence Act 1917, to make-up for the shortage in the Army. The officers and cadets dressed like the army. It was a significant step towards the Indianisation of armed forces. The National Cadets Corps can be considered as a successor of the University Officers Training Corps (UOTC) which was established in 1942, during World War II. A committee headed by Pandit H N Kunzru recommended a cadet organization to be established in schools and colleges which could train more young men in a better way at a nation al level. It was accepted by the Governor General and on 15th July, 1948 the National Cadet Corps came into existence.

The motto of NCC is “Unity and Discipline”(Ekta aur Anushasan).

It stands on four Cardinal Principals of Discipline:-

1. Obey with a smile 2. Be Punctual 3. Work hard and without fuss 4. Make no excuses and tell no lies

The Aim of NCC as approved by MOD in March 2001 are as under: -

- i) To develop character Comradeship, Discipline, Leadership, Secular outlook, Sprit and Adventure, Sportsmanship and ideals of selfless service among the youth.ce of organisation
- ii) To create a human resource of organised, trained and motivated youth to provide leadership in all walks of life and always available for the service of the nation.
- iii) To provide a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the armed forces.

NCC Flag contains NCC Crest in gold in the middle, with letters “NCC” encircled by a wreath of seventeen Lotus with a background in Tri-Colour Red, Deep Blue and Light Blue. Red depicts the Army, Deep Blue depicts the Air Force and the Light Blue depicts the Air Force . the Seventeen Lotuses represent the 17 Directorates and Two Dots represents Two Officer Training Academy

(OTA), i) OTA Gwalior, ii) OTA Nagpur. “Unity and Discipline” (Ekta aur Anushasan) is written at the bottom of the NCC Flag.

Sripat Singh College NCC is presently under the NCC unit 9 Bengal BN, Berhampore , Murshidabad which is under Kalyani group of W.B. and Sikkim dtes.

Sripat Singh College has taken a lead and joined the “ NCC” to train its students to join the services as officers and different forces. Sripat Singh College is a 4/9 company of 9 Bengal Bn Berhampore with 160 cadets (SD/SW) which include 110 boys and 50 girls. College offers ‘B’ and ‘C’ certificates for Senior Division/Senior wing (SD/SW) cadets. The College has an NCC Office and a parade ground for cadets. Students have a choice to opt for NCC as a proficiency course in first year. While pursuing the course, NCC cadets undergo different training programs as Drill, Shooting, Physical fitness, map reading, First aid, and camp training covering basic military training in Army. Cadets can also participate in youth exchange program to increase international understanding and bolster awareness.

***Training Activities: –***

a. Institutional Training – This training is mostly carried out in the college. It generally starts in May and continues till February.

b. Camp Training: – Camp training is an important part of the cadets. Every cadet is expected to attend at least two camps during one’s tenure to complete the training syllabi. Camp training is two types.

ii. COC (Centrally organized Camps) like Leadership Camps, Thal Sena Camp(TSC), Rock Climbing Camp, National Intregation Camp(NIC), Republic Day Camp(RDC), Special National Intregation Camp(SNIC) .

c. Army Attachment Camp: – NCC army wing cadets are giving an opportunity to live and work together with Indian Army.
